Program Updates 2022 (all talks will be held virtually at 1:30 p.m.)

September Meeting

We are pleased to welcome Francisco Miranda, a renowned specialist in native *Cattleyas* and *Catasetums* of Brazil. He will take us on a tour of Brazil Via Zoom to show the varied habitats in which different species of *Cattleya* grow along with the explanations of the cultural requirements of each. Francisco ran Boa Vista Orchids in Brazil for many years before moving to central Florida, where he established Miranda Orchids in 1999, growing, producing, and selling Brazilian *Cattleyas*, *Laelias* and *Catasetums* from his own stud plants. He is a well-known and sought-after lecturer. He visited our Society about 15 years ago when he was on an eastern tour that encompassed 14 societies in three weeks. This will be an interesting presentation, illustrated with beautiful photos which you will find both enjoyable and informative.

Meeting Time and Venue: This will be a hybrid meeting. The Zoom meeting invite will be sent separately.

Time: Sunday September 18, 1:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Location: Richmond Room, Nepean Sportsplex, 1701 Woodroffe Avenue

Entrance #4 (near the Southeast corner of the building). Take the stairs on the right to the second floor or use the adjacent elevator.

Directions to the Sportsplex

From the Queensway:

- Exit at Woodroffe South. Continue south on Woodroffe.
- Once you have driven past Hunt Club Road, take the **second** entrance on the left into the Sportsplex.
- Drive to the rear of the building and turn left to the large parking lot.
- Look for **DOOR 4** on the rear of the building. (This is the same entrance we used when the Show was held here many years ago).

• Enter Door 4 and immediately go up the stairs. The Richmond Room is 30 feet (10 m) straight ahead. There is a small elevator to the right of the entrance which can hold 2-3 people and plants at a time. Go to the second floor. Meeting room on exit is to your right.

From Woodroffe South:

• Heading north, turn right at the first entrance to the Sportsplex and follow the above instructions to Door 4 and the Richmond Room.

Additional Meeting Notes for the 18th:

If you intend to join us in person, please note the following:

- 1. Le Paradis des Orchidées (Laurent Leblond), will be selling orchids before the meeting (starting at 1:00 p.m.). Plants will not be offered for sale during the speaker's talk but sales will resume after important OOS notices.
- 2. Refreshments will not be served due to Sportsplex rules. Please bring your own drinks and snacks.
- 3. While masks are not mandatory, it is highly encouraged that you wear a mask to protect yourself and those around you.
- 4. If you are feeling unwell, please join us online rather than in person. Make sure to register for the online meeting even if you intend to join us in-person just in case one of the above occur.
- 5. The Richmond Room is a large room and may be chilly so bring a sweater unless it is really warm outside.
- 6. Please note that there will be NO Virtual Show Table. If you wish to show your orchids, please make sure they are clean, disease and pest free and **delivered to the Show Table by 1:20 p.m. at the latest**. Fill out the registration form for each plant with the names of the orchid and grower, and place both the plant and the name tag in the correct Alliance. If you need help, please ask. If you have shown the plant before, and its name was corrected for Spike, please use the corrected name. This saves Joyce a lot of time checking them out before publication. It is always wise to quarantine your plants for a few weeks on their return to your home.

We look forward to seeing you either in person or online for our first meeting of the 2022-23 year.

Montréal Judging Centre Updates (André Couture)

The Montréal Judging Centre extends an open invitation to the members of the OOS to attend its judging sessions. The Centre meets every month on the third Saturday (except in December when the meeting is held on the second Saturday). The meeting is held at the *Jardin botanique de Montréal* (JBM, Montréal Botanical Garden) in the main building.

Judging meetings

- The meetings start around 9:30 a.m. but the training session (open to participants) starts around 10:00 a.m.
- Plant registration is upon arrival or after 11:00 a.m. (but before 12:30 p.m.)
- Participants must bring their lunch as there is no restaurant on the premises
- Upon entrance at the main building, participants must sign in on the sheet for the "Centre de jugement" at the security desk
- The meeting room number will be indicated on the signing sheet (usually on the second floor) take the elevator on the right, past the double doors

Judging

- Plants are registered; the Registrar will provide the necessary help
- Participants must have the full name of the plants (plants with no name will not be judged)
- Participants must bring a <u>clone</u> name to assign to the awarded plants (the clone name is anything the owner chooses; the clone name must be provided at the judging session)
- <u>NOTE</u>: Plants must be clean and without pests, inflorescences may be staked; while plants are being judged, participants are not allowed to make comments or to intervene, and if there are any questions, these will be answered after judging.



Introducing Daniel Brumar (Conservation Representative)

I have been growing orchids since I was about 12, and I joined the OOS around 2018. I recognized a few native orchids as a kid long before I knew anything about them. It was only after Jan Johns gave me an orchid book as a gift ~3 years ago that I really started learning about our native species and seeking them out. Here are some pictures of some of my finds this summer. I think that watching hardy orchids thriving in their unusual natural habitats has helped me better understand how to grow my tropical orchids at home.

As we face climate change and a global biodiversity crisis, we need to change the way we think about the natural world and our place in it. As Conservation Chair, I hope to encourage curiosity and appreciation for orchids in the wild, and promote thinking critically about some of the "green" solutions being presented as answers to the climate and biodiversity crises.

Thank you so much Pat Boisvert, for getting our Conservation group together and started in the right direction this past year. Together with the OOS Conservation Committee, I hope these baby steps of education and awareness will soon lead to more substantial action on orchid conservation.


